What was the last message you received? Perhaps it was something in the post or a phone call. More likely, given our technological age, it was an email, text or WhatsApp message.

These messages are mostly mundane and fairly inconsequential. But sometimes they're memorable. This can be for good reasons, such as a job offer. Or it could be bad news, like loss of a loved one.

The Christmas story is full of people receiving messages. Whether to a whole nation, a group of shepherds or an individual, the words comprising these messages are so memorable that their effect has been felt for more than two thousand years.

The heart of these words is peace. This doesn't mean the absence of uncertainty, pain and conflict, but a deep sense of trust and rest, rooted in Jesus, irrespective of outward circumstances. It's a peace felt by persecuted Christians, despite the cost that comes with following Jesus.

For me, Christmas is Jesus, who was born into a humble family, but at the same time He is the Son of God who came to seek and save us. I think it's the best occasion to remember the story of Jesus' birth and celebrate His love for humanity. Allow Jesus to be the centre of your family and your life. It is He who unites us and allows us to enjoy peace and hope.

READ LUKE 2:8-14

But in many places around the world, like parts of Egypt where Muslim extremists are active, Christmas must be celebrated in secret, otherwise Christians could be in danger.

There are no Christmas decorations in the streets or any signs of celebrations. Actually, Muslims in my village curse Christians and I feel depressed because I can't respond to defend my faith. We gather as a family and my father tells us Jesus's birth story that happened in Bethlehem. We can't go to the church. We stay up and watch the Christmas night prayer on TV. But we lower the TV volume so not to be heard by our neighbours. I pray that my friends and the country know that Jesus was born. He left heaven and came to earth to show the way. We were sinners and He came to save us and give us eternal life. I pray that God opens their hearts and is 'born within them' at Christmas.

Unlike many Christian families from Iraq, Mimi and her family have been able to return home – helped by the gifts and prayers of Open Doors supporters. They were given a microloan to start a farm which is thriving. It's hope for today *and* tomorrow, because it secures Mimi's long-term future.

This Christmas, Mimi will play songs and decorate her house. She'll also give away eggs produced by her chicken, Lulu. "I like to wish people a happy Christmas and to give something to the people to make people happy," she says. "And when people are happy, Jesus is happy. It's His birthday."

The words of peace that accompany the Christmas story point to the 'Word [who] became flesh and made His dwelling among us' (John 1:14). The true wonder of this is most keenly felt amid pain, as God's close presence with us brings a peace that often belies outward circumstances.

You can become a channel of this peace to persecuted Christian children like Mimi. Please continue to remember our persecuted family who celebrate Christmas in the shadow of persecution.
