



### WHO IS OPEN DOORS?

Around the world, 380 million Christians face high levels of persecution and discrimination for their faith. For 70 years, ever since Brother Andrew began smuggling Bibles behind the Iron Curtain to Christians suffering under Communist rule, Open Doors has stood alongside our faithful brothers and sisters, strengthening those who risk everything to follow Jesus with practical, spiritual and emotional support. This includes emergency food and medical aid, trauma care, livelihood support, discipleship and literature distribution.

"Millions of Christians are displaced, here in Nigeria," says the pastor. "Millions of Christians are displaced in Africa. The news doesn't care about it, politicians don't talk about it, governments don't talk about it, global politics don't talk about it. Nobody talks about it."

This is why the African church is calling on their brothers and sisters worldwide to stand alongside them – and it's why Open Doors has initiated Arise Africa, a global campaign aimed at raising crucial awareness, financial support, advocacy and prayer for Christians, like Pastor Barnabas, facing violent persecution in the region.

Church on the Run / How-to Fundraising Guide























# The church in sub-Saharan Africa is on the run, with 16.2 million Christians driven from their homes by violence and conflict.

Church on the Run is a fundraising activity that invites your church to get on the move for believers, like Pastor Barnabas, in sub-Saharan Africa. Whether that's walking or running, cycling or swimming, skating or skipping – whatever the activity and distance – the aim is to raise vital funds, awareness and prayer for our displaced family in Africa.

"We have been starving, but any time it becomes critical, you assist us," says Barnabas, who pastors thousands of people at the camp. "If not for the help of your ministry, I don't think it would be easy for us to live. But with the aid of this ministry, they cared for us."





















### **HOW YOUR CHALLENGE COULD WORK**

There are loads of ways that your *Church on the Run* challenge could work. It's all about what will best suit and inspire your church or group. Here are some questions to get you started...



### WHAT WILL IT LOOK LIKE?

You could all do the same activity, or people can do their own thing. For example, one of you might run, whilst others might walk, swim or skate. You can be as creative as you like!



### WHAT IS YOUR DISTANCE GOAL?

Perhaps consider a distance that reinforces the *Arise Africa* campaign and the 16.2 million displaced Christians, such as everyone running or walking 16.2 km together, or the group doing 1,620 km collectively over a week.



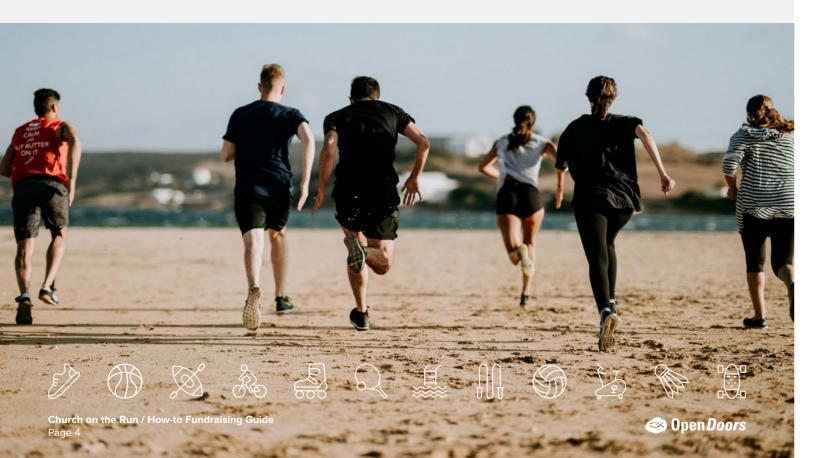
### **HOW WILL IT WORK?**

You might like to tackle the same challenge together at the same time, perhaps by signing up for a local race. Alternatively, people could take on their own challenges, with all efforts cumulated together.



### **HOW MUCH WOULD YOU LIKE TO RAISE?**

Set a fundraising target to help focus your efforts to raise sponsorship. Again, to press home your cause, you could have a fundraising target of £1,620.

- RACES OR DISTANCE CHALLENGES

   5 km or 10 km run
- 15 km walk

entry fee.

- 25 km cycle
- 1 mile swim
- 1 mile long hop or pogo stick
- 5 km skate.

### **COLLECTIVE CHALLENGES**

- See how far your group can collectively run, swim, walk, cycle, skate or hop over a week or month
- Ask people to set individual distance goals and add them together at the end of the specified time
- Think about setting a collective target around the numbers 16.2 (e.g. 16.2 miles, 16.2 km, 1,620 km).

### **INDIVIDUAL CHALLENGES**

- 5 or 10 km walk or run each day for a week or month
- 16.2 km cycle every day for a week
- 1,620 metre swim every day for a week (about a 35-minute swim)
- 500 skips every day for a month.

It was the third Islamic militant attack on his village in Burkina Faso that made Pastor Soré take his family and flee as refugees, putting them among the two million people displaced in the country. Like Pastor Soré, many of them are Christians driven from their homes by extremism.

"When the terrorists come to churches and find Christians, they tell them that Christianity's time is over, and they should turn to the Islamic religion," says the pastor. "They warn Christians to stop conducting services. After warning, when they come back later and find you in the church, they kill you."

Thanks to the help of Open Doors supporters like you, Pastor Soré and his family have been given much-needed food and support. "I do believe that we are displaced, but Jesus is not and will never be displaced from our lives," he says. "He is always with us."

**PRAY** for protection, provision and peace for Pastor Soré and his family, and all believers in Burkina Faso.

### WHY NOT JOIN A LOCAL EVENT?

If you are a big group wanting to do the same route together, it can be daunting and impractical to set up your own race, which will include risk assessments and health and safety practices, and could have an impact on the wider public.

Instead, why not join an existing event, like your local Parkrun, where everything from the route (5 km) to first aid are all covered? Check out the Parkrun website to find your nearest weekly Parkrun and get in touch with the organisers to chat about how your Church on the Run could happen alongside their existing event!

Alternatively, you might all want to sign up for a longer race, such as a nearby 10 km or half marathon. These events are regularly happening and are a wonderful way to set you a challenge and raise even greater awareness for our family in sub-Saharan Africa, all whilst enjoying the fun (and adrenaline!) of a larger event with crowds.

# **MEET FEDALIA**

Fedalia, her husband and their four children used to live a peaceful and exciting life in Kantoma, a village in Nigeria's Plateau State – that was until Fulani militants attacked, forcing the family from their home.

"You took us as your children," says Fedalia, after being among 2,000 displaced believers given aid by Open Doors local partners. "Since staying here, we never received such gifts. We are really happy and our mind is now at rest."

Aid included rice, blankets, pots and soap, as well as Bibles. "This Bible, if we are troubled and we read it, especially me, it calms me down. And this Bible will be with me from now till the day I die. It is one of the biggest gifts that has really encouraged us."

### **GET FUNDRAISING!**

The simplest way to raise sponsorship is through JustGiving, and we've set up a campaign page that you can link to your own fundraising pages. That way everyone can all see what different churches and groups are doing and see what's being raised! Here's how to create your own page...

- Head to www.justgiving.com/ campaign/church-on-the-run
- Hit the 'Start fundraising' button
- Either sign in or create a JustGiving account
- Set up your fundraising page

When asked 'Are you taking part in an activity?', Choose the 'Just fundraising' option. Skip the question about fundraising for an occasion. Now your page will be automatically populated with information about the Church on the Run challenge (but you can edit it to reflect what you are planning to do).

Share the page with your friends, family and church to start raising money!

### **DON'T WANT TO USE JUSTGIVING?**

No problem! Instead, print out copies of the sponsorship form at the back of this guide and give them to everyone doing the challenge.

### **GET PLANNING**

With your plan in place, it's important to give thought to any health and safety considerations. Read through our 'Staying safe' guide, and consult those in your church responsible for health and safety and/or safeguarding to ensure any races or church-organised activities follow the correct protocols. They will be able to help you with things like first aid and risk assessment so that everyone is kept safe.

### **GET PROMOTING**

Now you have a clear idea of how you'll be a *Church* on the Run, it's time to start encouraging people to participate! We've created the following resources for you to share at your church/group and on social media to get people involved:

- An editable **PowerPoint slide** for use in a church service
- Social media graphics promoting your challenge to your church (you can also use these in church emails or WhatsApp groups)
- **Graphics for participants** to share on their personal social media profiles to encourage sponsorship
- A short promo video to share in church and online
- An editable A4 poster to fill in, print and display around church

See if you can get some time during your church services to explain the Church on the Run challenge and to ask people to take part! You could share the powerful stories featured in this guide, including Pastor Barnabas', to further highlight why you're passionate about your church taking on the challenge.

And don't forget to share with people how they can raise money or sponsor those taking part. Highlight your JustGiving page (if you've made one), or direct them to sponsorship forms or other ways that you are collecting money.

### **MEET ALIA**

Alia\* is one of millions of Sudanese people who have been displaced since civil war broke out in 2023.

"Since the establishment of this camp, there has never been adequate food," explains Alia. "There are many diseases, we fall sick, we need medicine to cure us and our children. We also need schools for our children. We have so many challenges and pray that God will hear and see my tears due to this situation and war. We need water. We all need help to have toilets."

"We haven't stopped asking and praying to God," she continues. "We are hopeful that God will bring blessings." Last year, blessings arrived when Open Doors local partners provided aid to more than 20,000 believers, including Alia and her family.

"Without patience, one would not endure, but we thank God we are still alive," says Alia. "We are enduring, and we have put God first to help us. We have not forgotten about God because He is with us always, day and night."

**PRAY** that IDP camps across sub-Saharan Africa will be better equipped to look after people, like Alia and her family.
