GETTING THE WORLD WATCH LIST QUIZ NIGHT STARTED:

1. WELCOME

Tonight's quiz is put together by Open Doors - a charity who stands alongside persecuted Christians.

One in seven Christians globally face high levels of persecution and discrimination for their faith, and Open Doors' vision is that no Christian should suffer alone. Open Doors' secret networks support Christians living in some of the most dangerous places on the planet – bringing hope and vital resources to help them stand strong in the face of persecution.

You'll hear a bit more later.

We have six rounds for you – covering some classic quiz topics from geography and history to sport and music and film.

Mid-way through the quiz we'll take a short break to show a short video highlighting the places in the world where following Jesus comes with a real cost.

Make sure everyone is in a team

Get people to settle in their teams and make sure that every team has given themselves a team name and also has a pen, answer sheet and is good to go. Share how many points in total are up for grabs (60), which includes a bonus point for the team with the best name too!

2. IT'S QUESTION TIME

Start the quiz and run through questions, leaving enough time for teams to have a quick chat to discuss and choose their answers.

3. ANSWERS

Once you've completed each round, ask teams to swap their answer sheets with another team, then go back through the questions, this time reading out the answers. When you're done, get teams to tot up their scores, hand back the answer sheets and then begin the next round.

4. HALFWAY THROUGH: SHOW THE FILM

Let's give our brains a breather and hear why we're here tonight. Where do Christians know the real cost of following Jesus? The Open Doors World Watch List 2024 ranks the countries where Christian persecution is the most extreme - here are the five countries at the top of the list.

5. AFTER SHOWING THE VIDEO

You can support the one in seven Christians facing persecution tonight - every £1 donated and every prayer prayed strengthens brothers and sisters facing the most extreme persecution.

The simplest thing is to sign up for Open Doors mailings to get the latest updates from the persecuted church so you can pray, take action and give where you can. 6. START THE SECOND HALF OF THE QUIZ

Call the room and teams back together and begin round four

7. THE SCORES

Once all rounds are completed and scores totted up, gather in all the answer sheets to double check the scores and award a bonus point for best team name. Hand back the answer sheets to the correct teams.

Announce the winner by asking who got more than five points, 10 points, 15 points, e.t.c, eliminating teams until you have only one left. The maximum number of points available is 60 (that includes a few bonus points for very good answers and best team name). Don't forget to hand out prizes to the top three teams!





BONUS: WORLD WATCH LIST ROUND



In what country is it risky to wear blue jeans?

A. Vietnam B. Sudan C. North Korea

Answer: North Korea

Yep, blue jeans – in North Korea they are deemed a sign of American imperialism. But the North Korean leadership doesn't just want to have control over the colour of people's trousers – they want to rule over all aspects of a person's life, including their religious beliefs. The Kim leadership are thought of as divine, which means those who believe in another god are traitors. Christians, and their entire families, can therefore face arrest, torture and imprisonment. Up to 70,000 believers are currently in horrific forced labour or 're-education' camps.



Where is it dangerous to have a colourful car?

A. Kazakstan B. Turkmenistan C. Nepal

Answer: Turkmenistan

In Turkmenistan, the authoritarian government rules over large aspects of life – including the colour of cars. In the capital, fines have been issued to owners of non-white cars, and imports of non-white cars have been discouraged. But cars are just the tip of the iceberg. Churches are heavily monitored as the government tries to repress religious freedom. Protestant Christians are viewed with suspicion and viewed as extremist by the authorities.



Where could new parents get into hot water with the authorities for naming their daughter Sarah?

A. Ethiopia B. Laos C. Morocco

Answer: Morocco

The authorities in Morocco insist that all new children born to Moroccan parents inside the country must be given a name with 'Moroccan character'. The government's concern with maintaining a narrow Moroccan identity means it is also illegal to 'shake the faith of a Muslim'. That means any Christian who openly talks about their faith takes a big risk. Each year, Christian men are arrested and fined in Morocco for nothing more than having a Bible or discussing Christianity with a Muslim.



Where could listening to hip hop, rock and jazz get you in trouble?

A. Iran B. Egypt C. Indonesia

Answer: Iran

Iran is ruled by a strict Islamic government that rejects vast elements of modern western culture. That means music considered as Western is seen as a bad influence. But that rejection of Western culture also extends to religious beliefs. Despite Christianity emerging from the Middle East, it is viewed as a Western propaganda tool. Iranian Muslims who convert to Christianity can face arrest, interrogation and prison for their choice, whilst house churches are monitored and raided. But, despite the restrictions, reports suggest the underground church is growing fast.



Where would it be risky for a woman to go to a sporting event?

A. Nigeria B. Saudi Arabia C. Colombia

Answer: Saudi Arabia

Whilst women's rights are slowly improving in Saudi Arabia, only three of the country's stadiums are 'suitable' for female spectators. Saudi Arabia is governed by strict Islamic laws, which means it's not just women who face restrictions – those who don't follow Islam can find themselves in trouble. The majority of Christians in the country are foreign workers, who are forbidden from sharing their faith with Muslims. The small number of Saudi Christians generally keep their faith a complete secret or they will face violence, rejection from family and intimidation from the police.

In which country can buying a Bible bring you to the attention of the authorities?

A. China B. Sudan C. Nigeria

Answer: China

Not only has China banned online sales of Bibles, but online biblical and Christian-themed content is increasingly being restricted. In fact, a recent Chinese school textbook had rewritten one biblical story about Jesus showing love, grace and kindness to instead illustrate the importance of law, order and following rules. Churches face monitoring, leaders are questioned and under-18s aren't allowed to attend church activities.



In what country can it be extremely dangerous for men aged 18-40 to go abroad?

A. Bangladesh B. Uzbekistan C. Eritrea

Answer: Eritrea

Even though a peace deal ending the war between Eritrea and Ethiopia was signed in 2018, younger men are still expected to undertake compulsory military service. Very few leave the country legally, as the government refuses to issue permits, though many do try to flee. But enforced military service is just one way the government controls what people think and how they behave. When it comes to Christianity, only three types of churches are allowed – members of other church groups are aggressively targeted by the authorities, with more than 1,000 Christians being held in prison without charge – many in metal shipping containers in the desert.



Where can having a beard bring you to the attention of the police?

A. Tajikistan B. Mexico C. Vietnam

Answer: Tajikistan

In an effort to fight Islamic extremism, beards are frowned upon, and Tajik police have been reported to forcibly shave those who have grown beards. But the government isn't just focused on Islamic extremists – normal Christians are also being targeted. One pastor saw his church building repossessed by the authorities and was then imprisoned for three years for singing simple worship songs. These songs about love for Jesus were deemed 'extreme' by the courts.
